NY, NJ and CT to require travelers from states with high coronavirus rates to quarantine for two weeks

In a joint press conference earlier today, the governors from NY, NJ & CT have announced their intention to require a **14-day quarantine** for persons traveling from Alabama, Arkansas, **Arizona, Florida, North Carolina, South Carolina, Washington, Utah and Texas as of today**. The list is subject to change given the virus rates of each state.

Effective today, individuals traveling from select states with high virus rates, defined as a transmission rate about 10 per 100,000 people on a seven-day rolling average, or 10 percent of the total population testing positive on a seven-day rolling average will need to quarantine for 14-days.

CNN reports that “[f]ines for not quarantining are \$2,000 for the first violation, \$5,000 for the second violation, and \$10,000 if you cause harm, [NY State Governor] Cuomo said.”
